

On Monday, June 8, the Pride Foundation/Inland Northwest will honor Gina Marie Young as THE Individual "whose efforts have had a positive effect on the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and queer community of the Inland Northwest" during the past year. Westminster Congregational UCC was a nominee for the group award ("given to an organization for service to the LGBTQ community of the Inland Northwest, particularly service rendered in

Marj's Musings

When I used to sing in the choir “back in the day,” the choir director used to tell us, “Sunday is the day we take down the scaffolding to see if the song can stand on its own.” Keep in mind that Keith was a minister of music, not a building contractor, and most of the choir members were government or NGO “white collar” employees, but the analogy still sort of worked, and the anthem was often a rich blend of the 25-30 voices on any given Sunday.

This past Sunday we heard one of our members share a word of joy and testimony about another member’s young adult daughter. This young woman’s current vocation reflects some of the life and faith values her parents tried to teach and instill in her younger life. Working through a local program that aims to feed hungry people, Emily mirrors her hope for change in the community that her parents share with her through their own continued efforts. It is good to celebrate how our young folks reflect such lessons when they are given the opportunity!

As the academic year winds down, we’ll watch our young people of all ages try out their wings in choosing how they will spend their summers and take their next steps. May you know—parents and families, friends and teachers—that you have shared tools and resources within the framework of a “scaffolding” at home or school, in church or through clubs and activities in the community. I’ve no doubt that you have shared with them that they **do** have choices about to use their young lives to make change happen. So as our young people walk across stages or platforms in classrooms, halls or parks ... as they turn to see you watching from the sidelines or the stands for a thumbs-up of your pride in what they’ve accomplished so far, as you hear them shout ecstatically for having “made it,” may you come to trust that once the “scaffolding” is down, they will make choices appropriate for themselves as they seek to change the world in which they live, using the tools and resources you’ve offered along the way. Celebrate who they are and who they are becoming. Each one of us is, after all, on a journey to become all of

who it is the Holy One means for us to be. May we continue to offer the tools of patience, presence and persistence to one another along the way!

The unemployment in the Spokane Community has encouraged your church council to endorse a series of Jobs Transition Workshops. Scheduled to start in June, the workshops include training and support for individuals currently unemployed, facing unemployment or underemployed.

Meetings will be from 7:00 to 8:00 pm at the church on the 2nd and 4th Sunday evenings beginning June 14. The program will be divided into two segments. From 7:00 to 7:30 a speaker will cover issues such as resume writing, being a successful interviewee, various employment sources, and effective use of the Internet. From 7:30 to 8:00 participants will go to breakout groups where they can ask questions, provide mutual support and reinforce the job search process.

Movies You Can Borrow

Three fairly new releases on DVD are worth watching and sharing conversations over.

"For the Bible Tells Me So" features five Christian families (including former House Majority Leader Richard Gephardt with Jane and Chrissy; Episcopal Bishop Gene Robinson and his parents, Imogene & Victor; Mary Lou Wallner; Phil, Randi and Jake Reitan; Brenda, David and Tonia Poteat) and Bishop Desmond Tutu; Rev. Peter Gomes; Rabbi Brian Zachary Mayer; Rev. Dr. Laurence Keene; and Rev. Irene Monroe). This documentary shares and honest stories and glimpses into the lives of these families who have embraced loved ones who are gay or lesbian, answering questions like "Does God really condemn loving homosexual relationships? Is the chasm separating Christianity from gays and lesbians too wide to cross? Is the Bible an excuse to hate?" Runtime: 98 mins.

"Anyone & Everyone" portrays parents across the U.S. discussing their reactions to having a son or daughter reveal they are gay. Despite the diversity of the families' ethnic, socioeconomic, geographic and religious backgrounds, there is a thread connecting these stories. The heartfelt accounts of responses to children's revelations personalize issues that are often de-personalized in political rhetoric. Beyond questions of gay rights, parents wrestle with their faith, rejection by other relatives, the pain of their own lost dreams, and the fears born of their own and their community's prejudices and ignorance. Runtime: 57 mins.

"Through My Eyes" gives an unflinchingly honest look at the role of today's young Christians in the gay debate: what they really think, how they perceive the church, and what they wish other Christians knew. Over two dozen young Christians agreed to share their private feelings, struggles, and experiences on camera. All of them have a personal stake in the debate and hope their stories will make a difference. Runtime: 46 mins.

You are invited to borrow one of these, watch it by yourself or with family and friends and share conversations and discussions about the relevance of the work we share as an Open & Affirming congregation. Each DVD has a discussion guide or series of questions to move through conversations. Contact Pastor Marj if you're interested!
